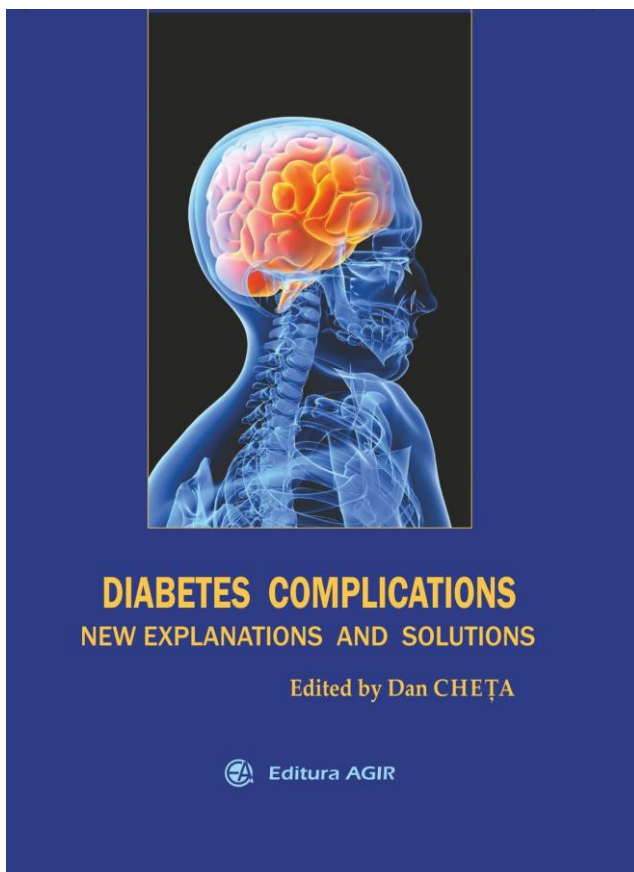

The volume “Diabetes Complications: New Explanations and Solutions” edited by Prof. Dan Mircea Cheța, MD, PhD was recently published (December 2014) at AGIR Publishing House, Bucharest, Romania [1]. From the foreword

supplied by the editor himself we find that the main intention of the volume is to revisit the topics examined in the “Vascular Involvement In Diabetes: Clinical, Experimental and Beyond” volume, published in 2005 under the same careful guidance of Prof. Dan Mircea Cheța. As the impact of diabetes and its complications increased in the last decade, another in-depth look at diabetes related medical burden, from epidemiology, to pathogenic mechanisms and further to their clinical correlates, was deemed necessary.

Over 70 contributors, mainly from Romania, but also from France, Switzerland and Germany, more than deliver on their endeavour to explore the mentioned topics. The volume consists of 663 pages, within 29 chapters, ranging from epidemiology, which is specific to Romania via the PREDATORR trial results, genetics, biochemical and cellular pathogenic mechanisms of diabetic complications, and finally diabetes associated clinical conditions, from diagnosis to bedside management. The style of the book is that of a thorough, up-to-date analysis of the explored topics, with a comprehensive

bibliography. The overall design and graphical presentation is carefully matched as to allow the reader to better understand the sometimes difficult subjects laid before him.

experienced, working in the field of diabetes, but also in connected medical specialties, who venture to gain a more in-depth understanding of diabetes complications and associated clinical conditions.
